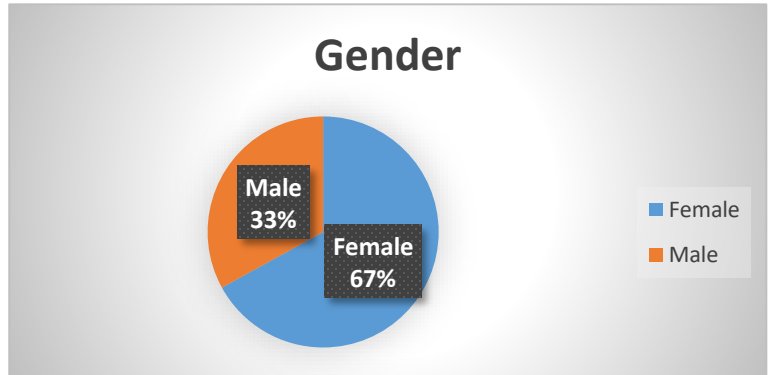

Total Number of Delegates: 99

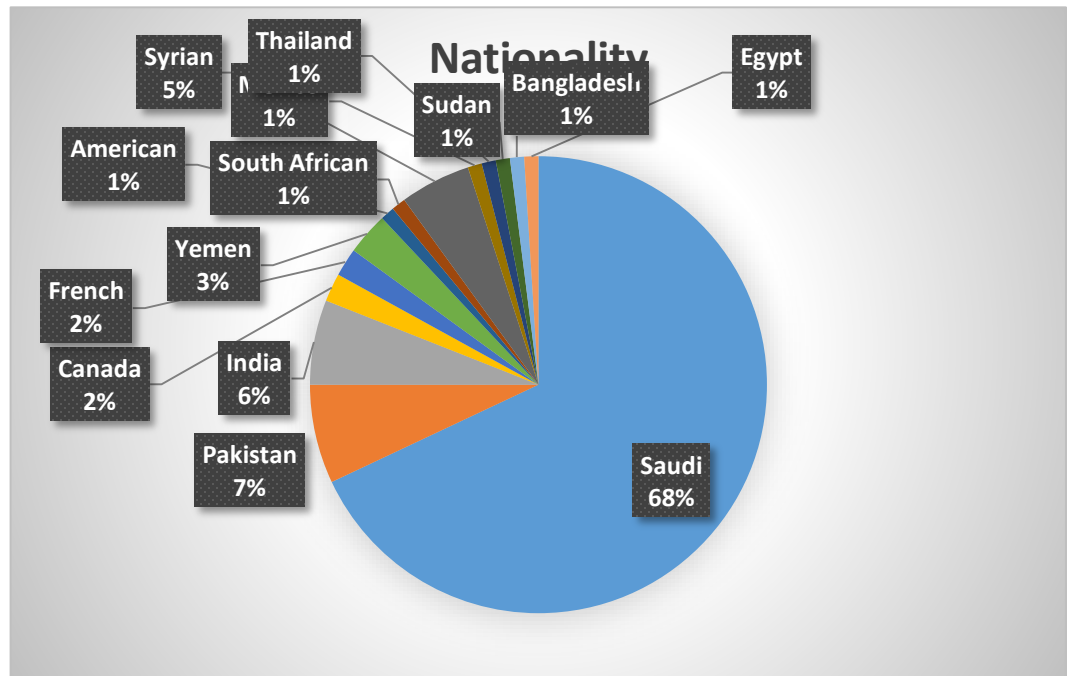
Gender

Female	67%



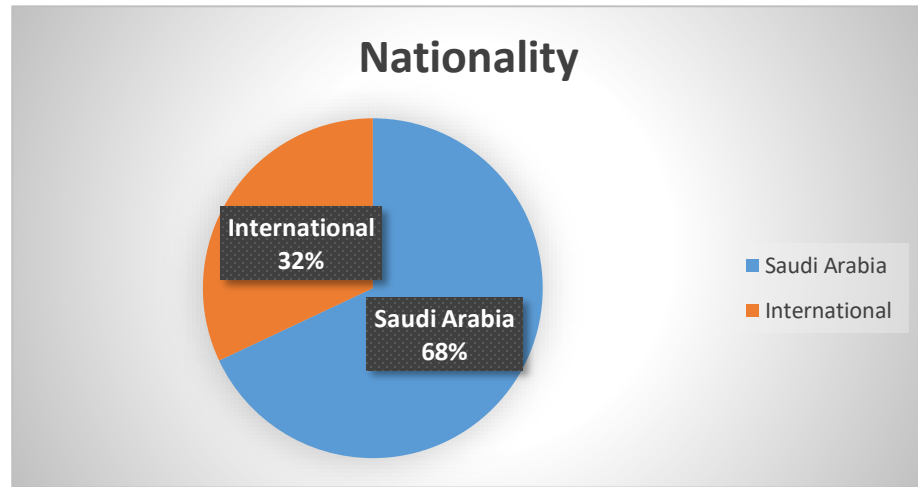
Nationality

Nationality:

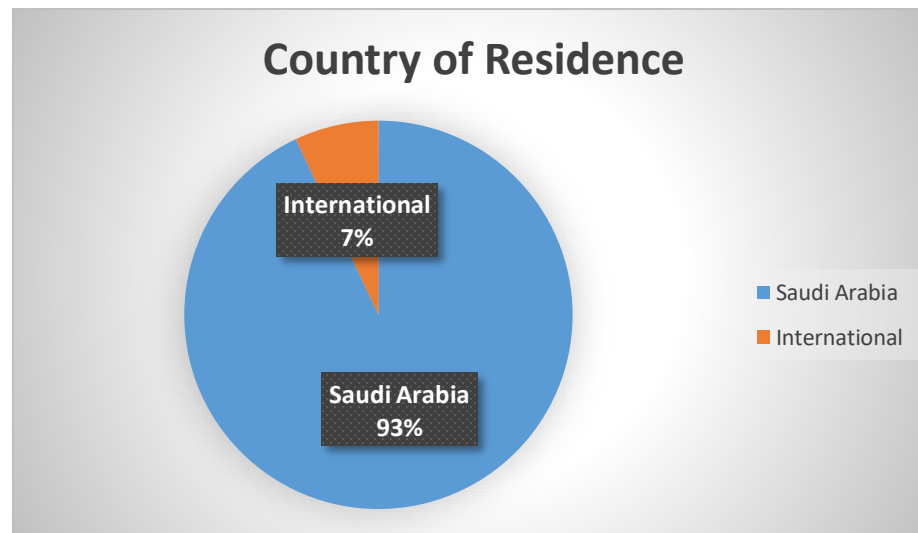
